SYLVANIA COMMUNITY SERVICES ANNOUNCES SOPHIA LLOYD AS NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Lloyd brings decades of multigenerational community leadership experience in the nonprofit and governmental sectors, most recently serving as Deputy Director of Lucas County Children Services.

Lloyd is an accomplished mission and value-driven nonprofit professional highly skilled in personnel administration, fiscal management, strategic planning, and donor development. She is adept at creating strong community partnerships and fostering a collaborative organizational culture. Lloyd describes herself as a servant leader committed to contemplative practices.

SCS Board President David Borgman stated, “The Board and selection committee are extremely pleased to welcome Sophia Lloyd to Sylvania Community Services. She brings a wealth of experience and leadership, and we are looking forward to our next chapter under her direction.”

Longtime Sylvania Community Services Executive Director Claire Proctor retired this past February after serving in the position for 21 years. In preparation for her retirement, a search committee was formed out of SCS’s 12-member board. After an extensive search and interview process, the committee recommended Lloyd to SCS’s Board of Directors at a special meeting on Thursday, March 24. She was unanimously approved.

Lloyd received her Bachelor of Arts in Social Work from The University of Toledo and her Masters of Social Work from the University of Michigan. She also holds an Organizational Development Certificate from DePaul University. Lloyd resides in Sylvania Township with her husband, Mark, who is Executive Director of the Children’s Rights Collaborative. Their adult daughter, Sarah, serves as Chief Resident of Family Medicine at Swedish Cherry Hill Hospital in Seattle, Washington.

“I am excited to continue my family’s value of service in the community by joining Sylvania Community Services’ dedicated Board of Directors and committed staff as

SCS enters its next phase of delivering high-quality services to the Sylvania community,” said Lloyd.

Sylvania Community Services was formed as a City of Sylvania, Sylvania Township, and Sylvania Board of Education joint venture and has served the Sylvania community since 1976. Sylvania Child Care offers safe, affordable before and after-school care, curriculum-based preschool, and extended break camp programs. Sylvania Senior Center provides health, social, educational, and recreational services to people 55 and over.
